

## Defining stakeholder priorities for a pediatric intensive care unit (PICU) family presence policy: Focus Group Study Information

WHO: [Past pediatric intensive care unit (PICU) patients or their families/clinicians, hospital/infection prevention control leader of/for critically ill pediatric patients during COVID-19 pandemic]

WHAT: A virtual (Zoom) focus group (60-90 minutes)

WHEN: At a mutually agreed upon time

WHY: To determine priorities for the design, implementation, and assessment of family presence policies in any context

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## **More Study Information:**

When COVID-19 came to Canada and hospitals wanted to stop the spread of the virus, all Canadian hospitals made rules (restricted family presence policies) about who could visit a patient in the PICU. The rules were different between hospitals, and it was necessary to change the rules as the pandemic progressed. Canadian PICUs need a set of guidelines for family presence in PICU that will apply in normal times and during a crisis like a pandemic. We need your expertise and opinions to help us inform recommendations for family presence policies across Canada.

We are actively seeking [past PICU patients or their families/clinicians, hospital/infection prevention control leader of/for critically ill pediatric patients during COVID-19 pandemic] to participate in a **60 to 90-minute** virtual focus group.
